

President's Report

The commencement date for the new Classic Vehicle Scheme is on the horizon. As soon as we know the date all our member clubs will be advised, probably via email. So please keep an eye out for the notification.



The Shannons Sydney Classic 2016 is taking shape very quickly. If your club hasn't put in an application for tickets they need to do it soon as the spaces are filling up fast. Areas A & B are essentially full already.

And make sure your affiliation has been paid or you won't be able to apply for tickets for the SSC. We are aware of at least a dozen clubs who have not renewed at this stage of the year. There is a 90-day grace clause in the Constitution and then all privileges can be withdrawn by the CMC.

The SSC is growing in content as well. We have been working very hard to try and fill the pit garages with merchandise as well as a some related industries, including a company who is involved in importing classic vehicles into Australia and all that the process entails.

The Free Spirit Markets may again this year, along with the entertainment for the kids with clowns, face painting, and The Balloon Guy is coming back as well.

We have two new bands this year and they will be set up on the edge of the skid pan rather than in a garage. There is a swing/jazz band, *The Escalators* and the rock 'n' roll band, *The Pink Cadillacs*, and there will be live music in Area D again this year.

The very popular event last year was **Come Ride With Us** and very soon we will be calling for volunteers to take part again this year. Last year's volunteers as well as the prize winners had a wonderful time and they let us know in the emails I received after the event.

And, 5 new trophies will be awarded for a brand new category, *The People's Choice Award*. In your Shannons bag you will find a small cellophane bag with 5 colour-coded voting slips inside. There is one slip for each area of the event. (A, B, C, D & E). We are encouraging everyone to have a walk around and choose your favourite vehicle (one in each area) and return the tickets to the CMC Garage by about 1pm. Once the votes are counted a trophy presentation will take place (around 3:30 or 4pm), for the best People's Choice vehicle in each area. So you need to stick around and see if you can take home a trophy.

AND YES, the catering will be much improved over last year. The new caterer had based last year's numbers on the 2014 attendance, which as you know, was severely affected by the bad weather.

We will be inviting a few dignitaries to attend this year. Invitation letters have yet to be mailed out so, we will keep you informed of the outcome.

We will also invite representatives of the RMS to attend the event to provide guidance for a range of processes covered by that service. Over the last few years the CMC and the ACMC have worked very hard to develop a very good working relationship with the RMS so, we do ask that when dealing with these representatives our members refrain from airing any complaints with the RMS and remain respectful. I look forward to seeing you all there.

Club Chat Guidelines for Club Committee Hand-over & How to Download Minutes

<u>These details should be kept with your Club Secretary or Public Officer and handed to the new Committee</u> <u>following your AGM or at a time immediately following any committee changes.</u>

The Committee of the CMC has identified some issues around club contact details, which are stored on our database, as being incorrect. This means some emails aren't getting to some of our clubs.

If you aren't getting emails from us it's possible that your details are incorrect OR your computer is treating our emails as SPAM. To overcome this, you need to check your **Junk Mail Folder** and if you find an email in there from us you will need **to right-click on the message**, then click on **Junk Email** and select **Add sender to safe senders list**, this should overcome the SPAM issue.

We are aware that at the time of the CMC affiliation renewal each year (31st December), your club's details may well be correct. However, your contact details and / or the details of your Executive Committee may change during the year for various reasons.

In order to assist your club with handover to a new committee, or Public Officer we offer a few suggestions below.

We sincerely hope that your kind assistance with this issue will alleviate some of the discrepancies, which appear each year in our records, and will allow us to keep you informed of important issues in a timely manner.

In order that RMS records for your club are kept up to date, the Council suggests that the details regarding any Executive Committee changes should also be advised to the Roads & Maritime Service as soon as possible. (*This service has been relocated from Grafton. Please call the RMS or visit their website for details*). This is especially important if your club has vehicles on HCRS. Failure to inform them may result in an application for registration being refused.

You must also advise NSW Fair Trading (13 32 20) of your Public Officer and/or address changes.

Note: Affiliation Renewals are due on 31st December each year.

With arguably some of the best views in Sydney, Georges Heights was once used by the military as a lookout spot to see approaching enemy ships. Visitors can explore the area's defence heritage and take in the spectacular views.

To the South-West, the **Campbelltown Steam & Machinery Museum** holds two open days a year. One falls on the same day as our NMHD event and the Museum welcomes motoring enthusiasts to visit on that day. It's an easy drive and there are some great exhibits to check out.

And this year, if you fancy a good drive , for the first time we have, as promised, a venue on the Central Coast: **Memorial Park, The Entrance.**

Allan Mead of the Central Coast Historic Car Club has very kindly sent me some information about the venue. There is a band, usually "Pink Cadillac", rock 'n' roll dancing, face painting for the kids, etc. etc. etc. It looks like a really great venue...

Allan says "Our first multi-club event at Memorial Park, The Entrance, (a superb waterfront location), was in May, 2011.

At that event, we had 67 cars from 6 local clubs. It has grown from that to 147 cars from 15 local and Sydney clubs in 2014. The event attracts around 3,500 to 4,000 "lookers" on the day.

Numbers were back down to 109 in 2015, due to inclement weather, rained all week before, and was still raining on the morning of the event. However, I am confident we will be back up to the 140/150 mark again in 2016."

Club Chat History of Illawarra Vintage Car Club

Almost 60 years ago the Illawarra Vintage Car Club was the idea of two apprentice motor mechanics, working at Dwyer's the Holden dealership in Wollongong. They both owned old cars and decided to see if anyone else was interested in a club for cars 20 years and older.

The meeting was held in October 1956 with six to eight people in attendance. That night the Illawarra Vintage Car Club was born, and by the end of that month there were about 20 members.

They decided on a motto for their new club, it was "Illawarra Vintage Car Club Forever Reliable" and they also designed a badge that had a wheel with an old car in the middle resembling a T Model Ford with their motto inscribed around the wheel.

They also made a club name plate to screw onto the number plates, one of which is proudly displayed today on a foundation member's club car.

Back in the early day's club events such as - Gymhunterques being a Gymkhana a Treasure Hunt followed by a B.B.Q., Collector Hunts - Gymkhanas - Reliability and Navigational Trials were great fun events. It was great family fun with



girlfriends, sisters, brothers and Mums & Dads coming along. From these events came the "Vintage 100" which is a surprise run with questions to answer on the way and when arriving at the destination. This event is still held today in the club.





The Illawarra Vintage Car Club continued to be a family orientated club that

enjoyed the social aspect of vintage motoring. The club was made up of mainly families with children ranging from a few months to teenagers, and most of the vehicles were in the 20's and 30's. Since then, the club provides a happy environment for historic car enthusiasts. Now in the 21st centenary we are mostly an older aged club, with a history stretching over 60 years, with vehicles from the 20's to the late 70's.

A few years ago a foundation member had a chance meeting with some members of the club, and re-joined the club with his family. The re-joining of this foundation member seemed to complete a circle of history for the Illawarra Vintage Car Club.

In 1994 at a turning point in the club a unanimous change was made. Members submitted ideas for a new badge and the new badge was decided upon. The significance of the centre-piece - that is the Illawarra Flame Tree - is immediately obvious. It is the tree of the Illawarra. The brilliant red of the tree catches one's attention and contrasts so well with the dark green and white of our uniforms. The club is indeed fortunate to have a logo so appropriate for our local area and they wear it with distinction - the "**Illawarra Flame Tree**".



The Electric Car Powered by Salt Water : 920 hp, 373 Miles/Tank

Tesla eat your heart out, the Germans have created an electrical car powered by salt water. It has four electric engines and is FAST with some pretty sweet fuel economy for a sports car. Leave the Bugatti at home and stop by the beach to refuel.

The recent announcement that the Quant e-Sportlimousine, which is a salt water powered car, has been certified for use on European roads is a big sign that the Oil Cartels are losing the energy war.

Since the early 1900s, the Oil Cartels, which are controlled by the Controllers, have been harassing and silencing alternative energy inventors who pose a threat to the Oil Cartels.


One of the greatest alternative energy inventors that they silenced was Nikola Tesla

Unlike traditional cars that run on gasoline, the Quant e-Sportlimousine runs on an electrolyte flow cell power



system made by Nano Flowcell that has the ability to generate an astonishing 920 horsepower (680 kW).

This salt water powered car can go from 0-62 mph (100 km/h) in 2.8 seconds and has a top speed of 217..5 mph (350 km/h). The Quant e-Sportlimousine is built by the German company Quant.

Electrolyte flow cell technology has been around for decades, but it wasn't until recently that certain car manufacturers were given the permission to start building cars that run on electrolyte flow cell technology.

This type of alternative energy technology will eventually make gasoline powered cars obsolete, because using electrolyte flow cell technology to power cars is a lot more efficient and much cleaner than using gasoline.

The car is powered by the electrolyte flow cell power system, which is a part of the NanoFlowcell technology. The system works in a similar way to a hydrogen fuel cell, except for the fact that salt water is used for storing power.

In particular, two liquids with metallic salts, which act as the electrolyte, are combined in such a way that the electrochemical reaction takes place.



After that, electric motors use this reaction to generate electricity, which is then stored and distributed by super capacitors.

The efficiency of this system reaches 80%, since the car has almost no moving parts in it, and the produced waste heat is insignificant in comparison with cars powered by lithium-ion batteries."

Alternative energy technologies, such as the electrolyte flow cell system, will become more mainstream as the new paradigm emerges. These types of alternative energy technologies will help solve our "energy crisis" and usher a new age in which we can live without worrying about not having access to cheap and clean energy.
