# **President's Report**

Progress Report on the Shannons Sydney Classic.

Firstly I'd like to remind you all about our new trophies for 2016.

There will be 5 new trophies awarded for a brand new category:

**The People's Choice Award.** In your Shannons bag you will find a small cellophane bag with 5 colour-coded voting slips inside. There is one slip for each area of the event. (A, B, C, D & E). We are encouraging everyone to have

a walk around and choose your favourite vehicle (one in each area) and return the tickets to the CMC Garage (50) by about 1pm. Once the votes are counted a trophy presentation will take place (around 3:30 or 4pm), for the best People's Choice vehicle in each area. So you need to stick around and see if you can take home a trophy.

When the time comes for us all to 'move on' in order to ensure our vehicles are looked after and not mothballed in a museum or private collection somewhere, we need to attract some young blood to the movement. So, this year, in the hope that we can attract a younger crowd to our event, we decided to advertise with radio Station WSFM.

We have made progress as well with our invitations to NSW emergency services with all services being invited. It's our chance to say THANKS to all those who serve.

To date we have received a YES from the *RFS*, Eastern Creek Area; *Marine Rescue*, which is based in the South East if Sydney; and the *NSW Dog Squad*. The *Highway Patrol* will attend again this year so it behoves us all to remain on our best behaviour. The *SES* are looking to see if the space and time is available for them to present an on site demonstration before they commit; *Fire & Rescue* are keen to come along and we are awaiting confirmation from the local area command. The *Ambulance Service* is seeking off-duty personnel and a vehicle (perhaps from their museum in Temora) to represent them at the event. Unfortunately due to the fact that they are under-resourced at the moment we probably can't get a current vehicle or personnel to come along.

The garages are filling up fast with merchants and I'm told we can look forward to some new people coming along. We have a power tool company on board who are also donating raffle prizes. We are negotiating with a car importer, a couple of automotive detailing product companies, a car cover company; novelty automotive themed products, a car photographer and the list goes on. Some products or vouchers for products will be in the Shannons bags as well.

If you're looking for a present for Dad for Father's day you will be spoiled for choice this year, for sure. There's plenty for the ladies as well with markets and even more for the kids with clowns, face painting and the ever popular Balloon Man is returning.

In short, we are pulling out all the stops to make this year the best ever SSC event, and hopefully, subsequent years will maintain the standard we are aiming for this year.

If you can't bring a car and enter the display come along and enjoy the day anyway and bring the family. See you all there.



# Club Chat Guidelines for Club Committee Hand-over & How to Download Minutes

These details should be kept with your Club Secretary or Public Officer and handed to the new Committee following your AGM or at a time immediately following any committee changes.

The Committee of the CMC has identified some issues around club contact details, which are stored on our database, as being incorrect. This means some emails aren't getting to some of our clubs.

If you aren't getting emails from us it's possible that your details are incorrect OR your computer is treating our emails as SPAM. To overcome this, you need to check your **Junk Mail Folder** and if you find an email in there from us you will need **to right-click on the message**, then click on **Junk Email** and select **Add sender to safe senders list**, this should overcome the SPAM issue.

We are aware that at the time of the CMC affiliation renewal each year (31st December), your club's details may well be correct. However, your contact details and / or the details of your Executive Committee may change during the year for various reasons.

In order to assist your club with handover to a new committee, or Public Officer we offer a few suggestions below.

We sincerely hope that your kind assistance with this issue will alleviate some of the discrepancies, which appear each year in our records, and will allow us to keep you informed of important issues in a timely manner.

In order that RMS records for your club are kept up to date, the Council suggests that the details regarding any Executive Committee changes should also be advised to the Roads & Maritime Service as soon as possible. (This service has been relocated from Grafton. Please call the RMS or visit their website for details). This is especially important if your club has vehicles on HCRS. Failure to inform them may result in an application for registration being refused.

You must also advise NSW Fair Trading (13 32 20) of your Public Officer and/or address changes.

Note: Affiliation Renewals are due on 31st December each year.





I pulled into the crowded parking lot at the local shopping centre and rolled down the car windows to make sure my Labrador Retriever Pup had fresh air.


She was stretched full-out on the back seat and I wanted to impress upon her that she must remain there.


