Another half year is almost gone and I have no idea where it went. Many meetings and events of recent times. I attended my first Road Safety Advisory Council meeting in two years. I was the only "outsider" actually at the meeting. The rest all came in via TEAMS. A train trip into the city was a novelty as I have not done so for the same period. So I sat there with six senior Public Service types. Very nice people and happy to talk afterwards. Always interested in the car club movement, so I do not miss the chance to sing our praises. Even the new Minister



for regional roads, Sam Farraway, came in via the video link. He spoke well about the Government's dedication to improving roads for the sake of safety.

Many details supplied about the road toll of recent times and the moves to try and keep it down. Still a case of regional road accidents doing most of the damage. And the myth that it is we folks from the city crashing on country roads is just that, a myth. The majority of deaths in the "bush" are locals it seems. The last couple of years have seen the lowest numbers of deaths on NSW roads since records have been kept. A lot of that would be due to the reduced amount of driving and riding we have been allowed to do due to lock downs and the like. I was very impressed by the presentations regarding how the roads are being improved. We can only hope they keep it up.

Then on to the launch of Road Safety Week at the Opera House. Great speeches by two of the Transport Ministers - Natalie Ward and Sam Farraway. Ms Ward is Minister for metropolitan roads. I think that David Elliot MP is in charge of our registration systems, as he is Minister for Transport but was not present. There are four members of the NSW State Coalition Govt who are listed as Transport Ministers - Rob Stokes MP is at the top of the list as far as I see it. A far cry from the days of Duncan Gay when he handled the lot. Very well and very wisely I thought. He introduced both the logbook and the CVS rego system. A true friend of our movement. The speeches by those involved in road trauma were harrowing to say the least.

The SARAH Foundation was started by a strong-willed couple who have had to live through the death by road accident of their daughter. How anyone can endure that is beyond my comprehension. The acronym SARAH stands for Safer Australian Roads And Highways. Which spells the name of their child killed on the side of the road a few years back. A breakdown lane that was too narrow is blamed but the inattention of the truck driver who hit her disabled car as a tow truck tried to pick it up is more the case I think. An NRMA road service man died with her.

The SARAH Foundation works tirelessly for better roads to save lives. They also speak about better attitudes from drivers and riders. The message this year is that everyone deserves to get home safely. There was mention of a petition presented to the Govt with tens of thousands of signatures on it. That was ten years ago. No mention of any action so far?



It's Almost That Time Again....

President's Report (continued)

A huge increase in minor speeding fines has created a windfall for the Government which is supposed to go to better roads. Cynical people may doubt that, but we are assured that it is true. No admission that this increase is due to a drop in the tolerance for speeds of less than 10 km/h above the limit, but it seems to make sense. Some quote it as up 750% in those low speed fines but that seems enormous to me. Whatever it is, you should be aware that there is minimal leeway these days.

I got pinged on Moorefield Rd in Roselands a while back. One of those 50 zones with limited sign posting. One point and a chunk out of my wallet so I have learned the lesson. 50 years ago it would have been a bit more I think.

Back and forth among the ACMC, NSW HMA, CHMC and ourselves regarding the issue with the Memorandum of Understanding for CVS. Those four are now the Approved Organizations for CVS. One of these days we will get the responsibilities sorted. Main fact we have been told to work with is that the checking for compliance sits with the person who gives the blue slip to start with and the pink slip for renewals. They have the qualifications and knowledge to sort out if the vehicle is within VSI 6 or needs a VSCCS Engineers certificate. Also should be able to notice if it has changed from the VSCCS since last year. We hope to get further with it at the HCCIWG meeting on 7th June. We will keep you posted once details become available. We must have confirmation that the above is the way to go or the Responsible Persons are at risk. At the same meeting we should hear more about the "new" number plates for CVS. I gather the samples have passed visibility testing at Crashlab so it is getting closer. Please do not go and ask for them yet. You will just get blank looks as Service NSW are not in the know just yet. When they are released we will let you know ASAP. Lester Gough is also on the case of logbooks being dated at the day of payment. If you renew your HVS or CVS early you could lose some of your 60 days. For the time being we suggest you wait until the due date.

And so we head towards the "rebirth" of the Shannons Sydney Classic in August. Quite a few changes out at Sydney Motor Sport Park which have Tony O'Donnell working hard to sort out which club fits where. Be advised that a new area called E2 will be in play. That will be to your left as you head down towards the tunnel under the track. It will hold a lot of cars and it will have to, as we are losing spaces all around the venue. New buildings will be commencing at the top end of area D behind the grandstand. Sub Stations for increased power have been installed in area A behind the pit garages. Freezer containers are in place behind block B for the caterers.

In September we in the CMC will be hosting the Annual General Meeting of the AHMF. The Australian Historic Motoring Federation Inc. is the national body, which we are a member of. This AGM has not happened in Sydney for many years. It will see around 20 delegates from SA, Vic, NSW and Qld in a face to face that will work through the issues confronting us as this new Government begins working in Canberra.

The green, teal and Labour make up of Parliament may not be kind to our movement folks. Just look at what is happening in the rest of the developed World as far as "dirty old cars" are concerned. We have to fight any moves to restrict us. It is unfortunate that a couple of state bodies have withdrawn from the AHMF in recent years - WA, ACT, NT and Tas are not members anymore. Best that the organization represents all parts of this country, so some work is needed to get them back in if possible. Having met with the new President of the AHMF, I am confident that he will give it his best shot.

And finally, further in this edition you will find a photo of a brat in a pedal car. That was taken 70 years ago in Round Corner Dural. Guess who? And the racetrack shot is Catalina Park in Katoomba. Nov 1965 with Norm Beechey leading Pete Geoghegan and Jim McKeown. Notice the crowd hanging from the rocks above the track. No grandstands up there boys and girls. The one of the crashed 48-215 Holden has a Police note on the back saying "Accident at O'Riordan & Ricketty Sts, Alexandria 24/12/55. Stolen car 5 killed".

Celebrations should recognise Anniversaries of Clubs:


5 years for first time anniversary, then in 10-year intervals. i.e. 10, 20, 30 etc.

- Major motoring events & vehicle models in time intervals of 10 years or multiples thereof.
- · Celebration of an event should only be for major milestones such as:
 - 1st Australian GP
 - 1st Redex trial or Round Australia Trial
 - Dening of 1st Holden body works
 - 1st Sydney to Melbourne journey by car
- Vehicle model anniversaries to include:-
 - ✓ Release of a new model name (excluding a series no. such as "XJ6 series 3", "First Mustang but not the fourth version")
 - ✓ Release of a model upgrade which includes a significant body remodelling or design (Spitfire 4 or MGB GT may qualify)
 - ✓ Release of a significant and innovative technological upgrade (Skyline GTR would
 qualify as distinct from early variations to the original Datsun Skyline)
 - ✓ Release of a model variation which had a major impact on Australian motoring events or history (Ford Falcon GT or Mini Cooper S would fall under this category).

This is the report that I have been wanting to write for more than a year, bringing some good news to all our supporters and to the clubs our Foundation is itself designed to support.

The times have been tough but we have put the past two years to good use. We have been busy consolidating our collections, our volunteer force and our relationships. The volunteers and initial donors are mainly from the clubs and they're magnificent. Our refurbished home building is fit for purpose, education and research is our specialty, the 'hub for clubs' is our focus.

The Foundation is now formally recognised as a Strategic Partner of the ARDC alongside the NSW State Government, Destinations NSW, the Blacktown City Council and the Western Sydney Parklands Trust. So we are one of five independent bodies all working with the ARDC in achieving optimum results for people who use Sydney Motorsport Park. That is great for you.

Clearly we have begun a new phase of growth, as an independent participant in the big new precinct for motoring innovation being built up by the ARDC at Sydney Motorsport Park. Our resources and our structure are sorted, in line with the objectives our founders first put several years ago to the ARDC, and the many clubs in the CMC. We salute Terry Thompson OAM, one of our six first 'visionaries' and now honoured Ambassador.

Our major project for the first quarter of 2022 is the installation of our custom-built relational database. It will be unique among motor heritage research tools in Australia. This is a big undertaking which will take our Foundation truly onto the national and international platform for world-wide access and sharing of resources expertise and research.

We will use it on all the heritage subjects and projects that interest our supporters. The owners and restorers of our cars will specially value it as the ICE cars are gradually superseded. Our education focus is a main part of the mission, we will be starting at the primary school level, we are looking for government support now that we can get out and about.



This cloud-based database is expensive to set up and to maintain, we have major initial donations but we will need funds and enthusiastic volunteers to use it well. Calling all clubs!

Our second project now under way, is an authoritative study of the economic impact of the motor heritage movement or 'industry' in Australia. The first stage, a desktop study of applicable literature was handled with substantial support from our partner the Western Sydney University and was finalised in December.

Now we are taking that to the next stage, seeking a partner and funding for the research and writing of the study itself. When finished late in 2022, this study will mark out the importance of the motor heritage movement in the economic and social landscape of Australia.

This 'big picture' work is for the clubs, and its secondary aim is at the governments of Australia at all levels. We expect that clubs, and most companies that service our historic and heritage movement—insurers, dealers, importers, venue owns, events managers—will use it as a tool to plan the pathways to a viable future for their business.

One final point. At last supporting enthusiasts and clubs can visit the Motor Heritage base now to see the way we have pulled it together during the two years of Covid constraints. Starters include the Mercedes-Benz Club, the Thoroughbred Sports Car Club, the HSRCA and ARDC, and the Rolls-Royce Owners. They have an overview of our volunteers' work and to see how we are managing our resources. Talk to us to arrange a club visit.
